Hummingbird Plants

Hummingbirds like nectar-rich flowers with elongated tubular shapes, adapted to their long beak and tongue. They will hover on fast-beating wings in front of a suspended flower and dip into it with their beak to sip the nectar collected at the base. Hummingbirds prefer flowers in shades of red, but will visit every color flower. They are inquisitive and brave in their endless search for food, and once they have found your Hummingbird Garden, they will return, following a regular feeding route, called 'trajlines'. Plant your Hummingbird Garden with attention to early nectar sources since hummingbirds return to the Seacoast area in late April. They have flown from South America and are hungry! Include a few hanging baskets or window boxes of bright annuals, twiggy shrubs for resting spots, a bird bath or saucer with crossed sticks for perching. Create a long season staggered bloom using the plant list below. Please do NOT use pesticides or herbicides in your Hummingbird Garden!

PERENNIALS

Alcea Hollyhock	6'; various colors; July-Aug; tall cottage garden biennial
Agastache Anise Hyssop	3'; blue; July; hardy herb; bees love it too; sun
Aquilegia Columbine	1'; red, yellow, blue, pink, white; May; woodland native; self-seeds; shade
Delphinium	3'; pink, purple, blue, white; June; gorgeous flower spikes; sun
Digitalis Foxglove	4'; pink, yellow; June - July; Victorian favorite; sun
Hemerocallis Daylily	2'; various colors; June - Sept; many varieties; handsome foliage; sun
Heuchera Coral Bells	1'; red; June; good hosta companion; shade
Lobelia Cardinal Flower	4'; red; June - July; striking native for damp soil; shade
Lupine	3'; various colors; June; will self seed; native beauty; sun
Monarda Beebalm	2 - 4'; red, pink, purple; June - Sept; cut back for rebloom; spreads; sun
Penstemon Beardtongue	2'; red, pink, blue; July; free flowering & upright; sun
Phlox Garden Phlox	2 - 3'; various colors; June -Aug; hardy old-fashioned perennial; sun
Salvia	2'; white, purple-blue; June - Sept; drought tolerant; deadhead to rebloom; sun

ANNUALS

Callebrachoa Million Bells	6"; various colors; May - Oct; delightful mini-petunia for pots, window boxes; sun
Canna Lily	6'; red, orange; July - Sept; tropical-looking annual for beds & pots; sun
Fuschia	6"-1'; red, pink, white; May - Sept; excellent in hanging baskets; shade
Gladiolas	4'; various colors; Aug; plant bulbs in spring, dig up in fall, hang in onion bags in cellar for winter; sun
Impatiens	6"; various colors; May-Sept.; everyone's favorite for beds & borders; sun & shade
Lantana	1'; orange, pink; May - Sept; bright, wonderful in hanging baskets & containers; sun
Nicotiana Flowering Tobacco	2'; red, pink; June - Sept; fragrant; drought tolerant; sun or shade
Penstemon Beardtongue	2'; purple, pink, red; June - Sept; annual variety blooms longer; sun
Petunia	6' - 4'; various colors; June - Oct; many varieties; sun

HERBS

Nasturtium	6"; red, orange; June - Sept; climbing variety is ideal on trellises; sun
Slavia Pineapple Sage	3'; red; June - Sept; dry soil adaptable; deadhead for repeat bloom; sun

TREES • SHRUBS

Althea Rose of Sharon	10'; pink, purple, blue, white; Aug - Sept; shrub or tree form; drought tolerant; sun
Azalea	1- 8'; red, pink, white; May or July; evergreen azaleas need winter protection; deciduous natives taller & hardier; shade
Buddlea Butterfly Bush	6'; pinks, purples, white; July - Oct; cut back in spring; sun
Syringa Lilac	3 -12'; pinks, purples, whites, variegated; April -June; early nectar source; hardy & fragrant; sun
Weigela	5'; pinks; June; colorful foliage; drought tolerant; sun

VINES

Campsis Trumpet Creeper	20'; yellow, orange; July - Aug; hardy twining vine; blooms at 3 - 5 yrs; sun
Ipomea Morning Glory	10'; purple, blue; May - Oct; old fashioned annual vine; sun
Ipomea Cardinal Climber	10'; red; June - Sept; delicate lacy foliage; bright flowers; sun
Lonicera Honeysuckle	20'; yellow, pink; June - Sept; hardy; fragrant native vine; sun
Phaseolus Scarlet Runner Bean	10'; red; June - Aug; plant this annual vine from seed; sun
